

Acts 10:1-ff




Background

- Cornelius
 - A Roman Centurion <u>Italian</u> regiment
 - A gentile
 - Jews believed not saved
 - Not allowed in temple
 - A God fearer -
 - Attended synagogue
 - Generous and prayerful
 - Served God out of love



Background

- Peter
 - Most prominent apostle
 - Still in Jewish mindset
 - Observant
 - Some movement
 - Samaritans
 - Stayed with a tanner
 - Still a Jewish worldview
 - God steps in



God's Intervention

- The <u>vision</u> trance
 - Highest prophetic level
- The <u>response</u> revulsion
 - Contrary to Lev 11
- The transition
 - God declares a change
- The repetition
 - Significant Hebrew idiom
- The instruction
 - Go and do not doubt



Dealing With Contradictions

- Does God contradict himself?
 - Hosea
 - Elisha
 - New Covenant vs. Old
 - God never not contradicts His nature
- How do we know if God is leading?
 - The Word (study)
 - God's Character
 - Conviction/revelation
 - Providence
 - Mature Christian counsel



- Cornelius had a God-seeking heart
- Peter was a fully <u>devoted</u> Christ follower
- Cornelius received the truth
- God sealed his acceptance evidenced by the <u>Holy Spirit</u>
- Cornelius became the first Gentile convert
- This event paved the way for the gospel to go to the world
